- 1. The meeting was called to order by Kristin Ochtera at 7:10 p.m. and Keith Gamache led the Pledge of Allegiance.

- 8. Superintendent's Report:

Ms. Ruiz reported that we are still continuing with the interview and hiring process. A newly hired art teacher just resigned and more positions still need to be filled. She explained that due to an increase in New York State aid, two new AIS teaching assistant positions were created at the Jr./Sr. High School in Math and Reading/ELA. All AIS services will be provided by licensed certified teachers in that area. A plan will be created to provide those services. Reading support was increased at the elementary schools last year and now the same can be done at the Jr./Sr. High School.

New teacher orientation is taking place Thursday and Friday of this week and introduction of new teachers will take place at the September Board of Education meeting. Workshops on lesson planning, APPR, professional responsibilities, and other topics will be presented. She thanked Ms. Guggino-Hastings, Mr. Piccarella and her summer intern for planning these workshops.

The Board of Education conducted the building walk through today. They viewed all the buildings and observed all the work done during the summer. Ms. Ruiz thanked Mr. Robinson (a/k/a Tour Guide), Mr. Quercia, and the custodial staff in preparing the buildings for the new school year. The floors were all freshly polished. She expressed her thanks to the entire custodial staff for working through the hot humid summer days. The new floor project in the technology building had begun. This project was a result of a major crack in the floor due to Sandy. The new floor has a wood-like finish and she believes the room will be much more functional. The maintenance garage also being worked on.

During her walk through the buildings, Ms. Ruiz saw the new tablets that were purchased for Gr. 5 and Gr. 9 students. Ms. Ruiz commended Mr. Piccarella for the foresight in establishing the infrastructure to support the tablets and looks forward to the program growing.

Mr. Piccarella added that this September students and teachers in Grades 5 and 9 will be receiving

tablet computers. Each year students in Grade 5 will receive a tablet computer, which will be replaced when they reach Grade 9. Grade 4 will have class sets of Chromebooks to prepare students for their own tablets in Grade 5. The program will be described at back to school night in each elementary school and at the 9th grade parent orientation at the High School. Student and parent responsibilities will be discussed and parents will be able to sign-out the computers for take-home use. Over the past several years the district has prepared for this one-to-one initiative by providing wireless internet access throughout its three buildings, establishing a ten-year capital reserve for technology, and establishing a Google domain for paperless collaboration between and among students and teachers. Teachers were trained by Ms. Schoen, elementary library media specialist, during the summer and took home tablet computers to prepare for this September. These teachers will continue to meet as a group with Ms. Schoen throughout the year. Next steps include training in a variety of Web 2.0 software tools and the delivery of digital content through the Kindle app on the computers.

Ms. Ruiz shared that the ELA/MATH scores were received. There was a large number of opt-outs; 53% of students did not take the ELA exam, and approximately 64% of the students did not take the Math exam. This percentage of students not taking the tests makes using the data for instructional purposes and assessments a little difficult. Additionally, some teachers did not receive scores. Ms. Ruiz stated that we have other reliable classroom assessments such as NWEA. She will continue to work on data analysis with the faculty. ELA/Math score reports will be sent home next week for those students that took the tests.

Keith Gamache:

Mr. Gamache wished teachers and staff a great start to the school year. He thanked the maintenance staff who worked hard to get the buildings ready during the hot summer days.

Neil Schloth:

Mr. Schloth welcomed back Karin Cooney who was reappointed as a teacher aide. Mrs. Cooney was excessed and is back to work after having been out a year. Mr. Schloth thanked the custodial staff for their hard work. He reported that the buildings look magnificent and believes that we are closer to working out all the bugs. The staff takes personal pride in all they do, even in the little things that were done and was very impressed with what he saw during the walk through. Mr. Schloth thanked everyone for attending the meeting and looks forward to working with them and seeing them all back in the Fall.

Patricia Nicoletti:

After the walk through, Ms. Nicoletti felt that the goals and visions that were set, are starting to come together and was very impressed with the buildings. She commended the administrative staff and Ms. Ruiz for being organized and able to get the ball rolling to put things into action. Evidence of this was the Steering Committee. She hopes to have a really good school year. Ms. Nicoletti welcomed teachers and parents back. She thanked the audience for attending this mid-August meeting and asked everyone to check out the new Facebook page.

Kristin Ochtera:

Ms. Ochtera echoed the comments of her fellow Board of Education members. She welcomed the East Rockaway School District to the 21st Century officially on Facebook. She also welcomed the

incoming kindergarten class, which will be the class of 2028, and congratulated all for the hard work that we are doing. See you all in September.
